When Al Gerwing first visited Maceio, Alagoas, in Brazil's impoverished N.E. in 1979 he was appalled by the slums, most of whose inhabitants had come recently from the country.

The rural exodus was caused in part by periodic droughts, but mainly by the owners of large plantations mechanizing, or turning from cane to cattle raising and expelling their many workers. Al noted how the slums of 1979 had increased alarmingly when he visited Maceio a second time in 1986.

At this time, retired from teaching, he began to study Portuguese, and soon made the acquaintance of various "movimentos" (movements of the people to achieve a specific goal) in the capital devoted to:

- 1. obtaining land for landless peasants;
- 2. lots, housing, infrastructure and micro-industries for communities of the urban homeless;
- 3. the rescue and education of street children.

When these "movimentos" presented him with proposals for improving the lot of their people, Al checked back in Canada for an existing NGO (non-government organization) that was already organized and ready to act. Today that organization is *Rainbow of Hope for Children* (with which the Alphonse Gerwing Charitable Foundation is affiliated) located in Wainwright, AB.



CURRENT PROJECTS IN ALAGOAS

Agriculture: The Foundation supports land reform which invests in small agricultural production whereby families cannot only feed themselves but can produce enough to earn a decent living.

Urban homeless: The Foundation supports programs that help to house street children and that educate youth and women in literacy, culture and life skills to counter the risk of abuse, violence and poverty.

Rural empowerment of women: The Foundation supports an organization formed to help empower women to overcome repression, exclusion and a denial of the rights of citizenship. It is a rural version of the education programs for the urban homeless.
